FamilyLife Parenting Initiative Update

Seems like just yesterday that we told you about the exciting Parenting Initiative project that happening at FamilyLife[®]. You might recall that I(Eric) went on a tour with our newly announced President at FamilyLife, David Robbins, to premiere the Like Arrows movie in several locations in the Northeast. Well, that tour happened in November 2017, so NOT YESTERDAY! About time for an update, don't you think?

FamilyLife officially launched the Parenting Initiative project on May 1, 2018. We are thrilled to report that <u>406,277 lives</u> have been directly impacted by the various resources and translations of the parenting project (through 6/30/2020). These lives represent homes that may be forever changed as a result of the exposure to biblically based truths. As a result, the overall impact is much greater than we can measure. FamilyLife has also translated these resources into Spanish, Mandarin Chinese, and Arabic.

As you might imagine, the impact of COVID-19 on the family has been and continues to be great. Many parents are struggling with how to 'survive' the immediate crises and looking for help. One of the benefits of the project was our online streaming access to all of FamilyLife's Art of Parenting[®] video sessions. These are now able to be used for people to create virtual small groups, during a time of keeping safe social distancing.

In August 2019 FamilyLife announced the move of our headquarters from Little Rock to Lake Hart, Florida. One of the main goals of this move is to improve collaboration with Cru, our parent organization, by colocating with them in Florida. At this point, the Little Rock office is closed

Due to COVID-19 concerns, the upcoming Florida move, and many other factors, she will not be returning to College of the Ozarks this fall. She has decided that an online degree is a better fit for her, and has registered for John Brown University's liberal arts major with a minor in communications. It is a similar degree to what she has started, but will give her the freedom to stay home, move to Florida, and/or travel while still moving forward with her education. The eventual goal is still a Masters in Library Science and a job at a public library.
