Leaders who minister through digital means tell me there are dramatic increases in online searches on finding hope and peace, and overcoming fear and worry. A man in Kenya wrote of his deep concern over the pandemic, but upon receiving Christ, that he was "now happy as a child of God." Another person asking for help on a ministry website said, "I'm not really a religious person, but I don't know who else to turn to but God."

The means now exist to touch the lives of the vast majority of people on earth without face to face contact! As more people find themselves out of a job, those who are strong Christians among them may well have more time to minister to others digitally.

A few months ago it was estimated that 62% of the world's population now uses mobile phones. That means,
